Chair's Corner

Happy Spring! As you have probably noticed, our roadways and common areas are littered with trash. Littering is illegal and totally unnecessary and unfortunately, we do not have inmate labor to help manage this problem anymore. We want to keep the County where we live clean and welcoming. Therefore, the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors is once again sponsoring our **One Bag Challenge** to aid in cleaning up our county. This year, we are excited to announce the Pulaski County School Board is joining the Board of Supervisors in challenging members of the community, our towns, businesses, and nonprofits to help collect litter along roadways and waterways in the county and to provide educational opportunities to our younger citizens.

The "One Bag Challenge" began in 2023 and was very successful with 237 participants collecting 849 bags of trash and 275 tires, resulting in an award from the Virginia Association of Counties. We hope to surpass those numbers this year with a goal of 1,000 bags and 300 tires! Participants who pick up trash could win a \$100 VISA Gift Card for their photo submissions. For each full bag of trash collected, the participant's name will be entered into a monthly drawing. The Board of Supervisors and School Board will each draw three names at their monthly March, April, May, and June meetings. Please submit bag counts, participant names and pictures to Laura Walters, by text at 540-230-6272 or email at <u>lwalters@pulaskicounty.org</u> to be included. Pictures will be posted on the Clean Community Council Facebook page. In addition, groups or individuals can Adopt a Spot for a year and receive a sign with their names and logo. Larger prizes will be available at the end of the year for those who collect the most trash.

In addition, the School Board is offering two educational programs regarding trash collection and recycling. The first, "One Bag Challenge Scholarship", a \$500 scholarship opportunity, will be awarded to a Pulaski County middle or high school student. To be considered for the scholarship, students must design a poster with information regarding littering and submit a 750-1,000-word essay on "How to End Littering in Your Community". These should be submitted to <u>onebagchallengescholarship@pcva.us</u> by April 15. The scholarship winner will be announced at the May School Board Meeting. Elementary age students also have a chance to participate in a coloring challenge. The coloring sheet can be downloaded at <u>www.pcva.us</u>. Pre-K – 5th grade students are invited to color the page and submit it with their name, grade, school to <u>onebagchallenge@pcva.us</u> by April 15. Winners from each school will be selected and announced at the May School Board Meeting.

Each school in the Pulaski County school system will also participate in the Adopt a Spot program. The schools will adopt the area around their school and commit to keeping it clear of litter and trash for the coming year. The hope is others will see the hard work of our students in keeping these areas clean and choose to dispose of their trash appropriately. This program is also open to all groups, organizations, nonprofits, and businesses. For those committing to this, a sign with the name and logo of the group will be provided for the spot adopted. Prizes will be given to the groups at the end of the year who pick up the most trash. Literacy NRV Volunteer Tutor Training



Skelton 4-H Educational Conference Center, Wirtz, Virginia. Pulaski youth get to explore new interests from robotics, technology, animal science, climbing, bottle rockets, archery, riflery, cooking and arts and crafts to name some, while also learning citizenship, ethics, leadership, morals and life skills. 
Upcoming Exhibits

Commissioner of the Revenue Reminders

- We provide FREE Virginia Income Tax Filing help in addition to an "Accelerated Refund" screening. Bring the following items to our office by May 1st for assistance:
 - ID
 - Federal Tax Return
 - W-2 and all other income forms showing Virginia taxes withheld
- If you operate a hotel, motel, or provide temporary lodging for transient guests in Pulaski County (excluding the towns), you need to submit necessary paperwork concerning the required local taxes to be collected. Contact Master Deputy Commissioner, Sabrina Bishop at (540) 980-7750 for more details.
- Frequently Asked Question: Does your office have the right to come onto my land?
 - Yes. Virginia law allows our office to assess real estate on-site as mentioned in section § 58.1-3280.
 - Why? The assessing agent wants to gain the most accurate information possible as to not assess property too high or too low.
 - If the real estate owner asks the assessor to leave before we have obtained all necessary information, we will perform a statutory assessment with only the information we have available which may not be as accurate as possible. It is more beneficial to allow a physical examination to clarify property details instead of receiving a statutory assessment.
