SUBJECT: Reports from the County Administrator and Staff

- a. <u>Collection Staff Activity</u>:
 - 1. <u>Adjustments</u> Adjustments totaling \$549.60 cr. are submitted as shown on the <u>enclosed</u>.
 - 2. <u>Inmate Availability Reports</u> Staff reports the inmate count for February provided one inmate per day.
 - 3. <u>Balance Due Report</u> See <u>enclosed</u>.
 - 4. <u>Lien Report</u> See <u>enclosed</u>.
 - 5. <u>Work Order Count</u> 0 brush; 0 large item; 0 tires; 0 refrigerators.
- b. <u>Ownership Transfer Walter's Mobile Home Park</u> I may have a proposal from Mike Boyer to present for consideration by the Board.
- c. <u>Adoption of Proposed Member User Agreement & Adoption Resolution</u>- Adoption of the <u>enclosed</u> resolution authorizing a change in the method in which Pepper's Ferry handles debt service is requested. The Board of Supervisors approved revisions to the agreement at its February 25, 2002 meeting.
- d. <u>American Electric Power (AEP) Electricity Purchase Agreement</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is a sample resolution authorizing continuation of current electric service arrangements with AEP. While at a slightly higher rate than current billings, adoption of this resolution is required to avoid having to purchase electricity on the spot market at what is both currently and projected to be higher rates. The electric service contracts with AEP currently expire June 30, 2002 unless extended. As you may know, the General Assembly adopted the Virginia Electric Utility Restructuring Act in 1998 whereby retail customers are granted a choice as to whether they will continue to purchase the generation element of this service from an alternative supplier. The distribution and

transmission elements remain with AEP. The VML Steering Committee recommends that all jurisdictions in the AEP area elect to extend the contracts with AEP from June 30, 2002 through June 30, 2007. However, the county could also choose to either terminate the current contract with AEP and seek proposals from alternative supplies or extend the current contract with AEP from July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2003 at the applicable rates on file for a retail customer at the State Corporation Commission.

- e. <u>PSA Annual Water Settlement Calculations</u>- *Enclosed* are settlement calculations for the Towns of Pulaski and Dublin for FY 01. Based on audited expenditures for FY 01, a credit is due both towns (Dublin \$47,938.25 and Pulaski \$15.73).
- f. <u>Informational Items</u> –Information is <u>enclosed</u> regarding the following:
 - <u>Responses to Inquiry on Public Utility Bill Relief</u> As shown on the <u>enclosed</u> summary, very few localities provide any type of bill relief.
 - <u>Garbage Collection Automation</u> The Virginia Municipal League, as our workmen's compensation insurer, recommends consideration to utilizing an automated system. Staff recommends consideration of a one-operator system, if the Board concurs with this approach. Given a general interest on the part of the Board, we would review how such efforts have worked for other localities.
 - 3. <u>Comparison of Compactor-type Roll-off Container Rates</u> Net savings for the account I used as a comparison amounted to \$400 per month if PSA services were used. An evaluation of lost customers over the past few years is directly related to the availability of compactor-type units.
 - 4. <u>HB 1130 Hookup Requirements for Water Systems</u> We do not believe the PSA would be adversely affected but wanted the Board to be aware of this proposed legislative change.
 - 5. <u>NRIP Sewer Project</u> The <u>enclosed</u> contract provides for upgrading existing pump stations rather than replacing the stations at a significantly lower cost to the County. However, there will only be an increase in peak vs. actual pumping capacity.

 Personnel Incentive Program - I would like to discuss the possibility of encouraging employee interest in service and budgeting matters by instituting a bonus pay program which would be dependent on a reduction in operating costs coupled with an increase in customer satisfaction. My thoughts are to return to the employees half of operating cost savings over expenditures last year budget savings up to \$400 per guarter (fuel costs would be recalculated based on usage to eliminate the effect of changes due to fluctuating market prices). Customer satisfaction would be measured based on quarterly surveys included in the billing statements. would like to institute this with the new fiscal year and eliminate the early release time as well as any payment of overtime for work less than 40 hours per week actual time on the job. My goal is to encourage employee ownership and concern for customer service. I would appreciate suggestions as to how the specifics of such a program are worked out and will be polling other jurisdictions to see if or how similar programs may be administered. My thinking would be to make the program applicable to all PSA employees including water treatment and distribution, billing and refuse collection. I would like to institute a similar program for county employees and am looking for the appropriate measure of citizen satisfaction.
