SUBJECT: Reports from the County Administrator and Staff

a. <u>Collection Staff Activity</u>

- 1. <u>Adjustments</u> Adjustments totaling \$16,535.85 are submitted for the Board's approval. A report detailing the adjustments is not available at this time due to the new billing system implementation.

- b. Rockwood Farms (Bell Property) Water & Sewer A draft copy of the preliminary engineering report for this project has been completed and will be available for review in the office. This report indicates that to supply water at a residual pressure of 35 psi (the lower range of residual pressure requested by the developer) to the site, the cost would be \$341,000. This option provides a new water line from the existing line along Route 100, Cleburne Boulevard, and Route 11, Lee Highway to the site. To supply 40 psi residual pressure (upper range of residual pressure requested by the developer) the cost is estimated to be \$536,000. This option is the same as above, with the addition of a connection to the Town of Dublin water system near the college. The sewer system is estimated to cost \$137,000. This proposal would only provide sewer to the site and pump it across the railroad tracks to the Dublin Interceptor. To serve a larger area which would include a line to the vicinity of the intersection of Route 643, Cougar Trail Road, and Route 11, Lee Highway, the cost is estimated to be \$675,000.
- c. <u>Volvo Connection to Town Water System</u> It has been determined that a connection to an existing Town of Pulaski water line was made to serve Volvo. Staff is researching the legality of this connection based on current service area agreements with the town.
- d. <u>Eagleview Mobile Home Park</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is a preliminary commitment from the Virginia Department of Health for financing water service through the Eagleview Mobile Home Park. Also <u>enclosed</u> is a commitment of \$5,000 for planning/design.

- e. <u>Lee Highway Court Water & Sewer Service</u> –Mr. Huber has informally determined that the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development have denied the application for water and sewer service to Lee Highway Court. Documentation of the evaluation criteria have been requested. Furthermore, Mr. Huber recommends the PSA consider applying for Virginia Department of Health funding of this project.
- f. Polyester Mobile Home Park Water & Sewer Enclosed is a letter from Mr. Whited accepting the cost of this project, and related user charges. Authorization to seek financing for this project is recommended based on the understanding that Mr. Whited will enter into an agreement to repay all PSA costs if not otherwise done so through billings for individual usage. As with all projects, efforts to keep costs to a minimum will be pursued.
- Personnel Changes Enclosed is an update from Management Services Director g. Nancy Burchett of recent personnel changes. In addition, PSA Sanitation Worker, Mr. Oscar Sherman, has questioned the uniform application of recent general pay adjustments. Mr. Sherman is a senior sanitation worker, with three years service in that job classification. His current compensation is \$20,675 per year. The senior sanitation worker range is \$19,950 to \$23,100 per year. Effective July 1, some sanitation workers that are not at senior status received an increase when the pay ranges benefited from the five percent overall increases approved in the budget adoption. The pay range for sanitation workers increased from \$16,536 - \$20,670 to \$17,363 - \$21,704. The pay range for senior sanitation workers increased from \$19,000 - \$22,000 to \$19,950 - \$23,100. Workers not at the top of the pay range did not receive increase on July 1, but will be eligible for an increase by February 1. Since the pay ranges for sanitation workers and senior sanitation workers overlap, it is possible for a senior sanitation worker to make less than a sanitation worker. However, the senior worker has a greater earnings potential. Under the county grievance policy, as well as state law, wages and salaries are not deemed grievable, although that finding of not grievable may be appealed to the circuit court. It is recommended that no adjustment be made in the compensation of Mr. Sherman solely due to the overlap of the pay ranges and the different times of year that general increases and increases toward fully pay are usually awarded. Possible salary increase in February will be discussed with Mr. Vest and Mr. Sherman pending resolution of performance issues. We are advised Mr. Sherman may seek assistance to express his concerns to the Board of Directors.
- h. <u>User Rate Model Evaluation Art Mead Enclosed</u> for your information is a letter from Charles Maus regarding consideration by the Authority for reviewing means of allocating capacities at the Pepper's Ferry Regional Waste Water Treatment Plant. I plan to discuss how best to calculate the value of the county's existing investment in excess treatment capacity. Board members opposed to the general concept are asked to contact Mr. Huber. See <u>enclosed</u> background report from Mr. Morgan recommending an independent study of the matter.

- i. <u>Radford Pump Station Capacity</u> As the result of the recently installed NRIP pump station, the PSA owns 100,000 gallons excess pumping capacity in the City of Radford pump station. It is doubtful this capacity will ever be needed by the PSA. At the same time, Montgomery County has need of this capacity. Thus, the PSA may want to consider rental or sale arrangement. <u>Enclosed</u> are Mr. Huber's calculations related to the matter.
