- b. Assistance with Grant and Loan Applications – Mr. David Rundgren, New River Valley Planning District Commission Executive Director, has offered to assist the Board of Supervisors in applying for various water and sewer projects. Specifically, the PDC will pay half the cost of documented time spent by Lydeana on Pulaski County water and sewer projects. Lydeana is experienced in assembling application for Rural Development and other funding agencies. The Board of Supervisors would be responsible for paying half of her salary and related expenses for the portion of her time spent on the following projects: Dunkard's Bottom Water Project; Orchard Hills Sewer Project; Draper Golf Course (Tank); Draper Sewer & Water Study; Loving Field Sewer Project; Highland Park Sewer Project; Rolling Hills Sewer Project; Sunny Acres Sewer Project; and Mobile Home Park Projects including Gateway sewer, Lee Highway Court water, Tiny Town sewer & water, Mabry Court water and Polyester water & sewer. **Enclosed** is a memorandum from Barry Long explaining each project. PSA concurrence with this arrangement is recommended since overall costs are expected to be within the \$10 to \$15 per hour previously authorized for this purpose by the Board of Supervisors
- d. <u>Staffing Changes</u> Mr. Larry Vest notified Mr. Mayberry and me he is evaluating his continued supervision of the refuse department. There seems to be several factors involved including absenteeism, citizen complaints, and other issues. In order to give Mr. Vest unencumbered time to consider matters, Mr. Kenny Stoots has been asked to fill in for Mr. Vest for the next three weeks. I met with Refuse Department employees

Wednesday to discuss the situation, and Mr. Mayberry instituted enforcement of sick leave and early release policies (7 of 24 employees were absent on Wednesday, November 29th). Authorization is requested in making the above personnel changes, as well as other modifications as may be necessary, pending ratification by the Board at the January meeting.

- e. Ratification Flex Benefit Plan Administration Administrative Services Agreement with Hunt, DuPree, Rhine & Associates Ratification is requested for the continued use of Hunt, Dupree, Rhine & Associates, Inc. for the administrative services provided for the county's employee flexible benefits plan (cafeteria plan). The amount quoted is the same amount currently paid for these services. Therefore, we see no need to change for the administration of this plan. *Enclosed* is a copy of the agreement.

 - 4. Audit Report Staff has received the preliminary draft of the audit which indicates a net cash gain of \$17,372 prior to calculation of depreciation. With a depreciation of \$631,424, there was a net income loss of \$223,728. More specifically, \$565,970 in profits from water and sewer carried a \$300,193 loss in the garbage department. This loss is partially attributable to improved service through the operation of drop centers and increasing payroll costs due to the loss of inmate labor. The collection of garbage revenues by the Town of Pulaski should increase collections by approximately \$144,000 and staff recommends the PSA approach the Town of Dublin regarding a similar arrangement where PSA garbage customers receive water service from the town (generally in the subdivisions outside the corporate limits). Increasing garbage rates by \$2 per month would address current losses.
