b. <u>Action Items</u>:

- 1. <u>Minutes of Previous Meeting</u> *Enclosed* are the minutes of the January 2009 meeting for your review and approval.
- 2. <u>Accounts Payable & Budget Adjustments</u>– Review and approval of the <u>enclosed</u> accounts payable and budget adjustment is requested.
- 3. <u>Scheduling of Orientation & Tour</u> We would like to schedule a tour of PSA facilities and a review of existing policies as may be desired by new and existing Board members. The tour would take approximately a half-day and could be scheduled while the Board is together at the meeting.
- 4. <u>Packet Changes</u>- Staff proposed uses a three ring binder for future PSA packets, rather than the spiral binders. Using a three ring binder would allow Board members to pull information from the packets as needed. The binders could be left with staff following each PSA meeting and the information contained in the packet removed and taken by PSA Board members if desired.

c. Informational Items:

- 1. <u>Personnel Changes</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is a listing of recent personnel changes as prepared by Norma Spence.
- 2. <u>Financial Report</u> A copy of the monthly financial report for the PSA is <u>enclosed</u>.
- 3. <u>Utility Projects</u> Currently, the mobile home park projects are bid and steps are being taken to move toward closing of the loans and execution of construction projects. The Subdivision Sewer and Highland Park Sewer projects are moving toward approval to bid. The remaining work is being done by the County staff and we have discontinued utilization of administrative services by the New River Planning District Commission.
- 4. <u>2009 Experience Mod Calculations</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is e-mail from McNeary, Inc. providing the June 1, 2009 Experience Modification worksheets reflecting mod factors to be applied to the county and PSA July 1, 2009 worker's comp premium calculations.

- 5. <u>Pulaski-Wythe Water Connection Model</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is correspondence from Martin Jansons of the Civil Engineering firm of Peed & Bortz providing a report on the Pulaski-Wythe Water Connection Model.
- 6. <u>Time Equities</u> <u>Enclosed</u> are reimbursement calculations for the New River Industries/Time Equities/Hort account. Time Equities (owner) is protesting the withholding of utility payments due from New River Industries who was their tenant under a buyout arrangement for the building.
- 7. <u>Accounting of Utility Customers</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is an accounting of public water and sewer coverage in Pulaski County.
- 8. <u>Wheatland Hills Dumpster Service</u> Wheatland Hills is concerned that the monthly cost for PSA dumpster service is more than would be charged by Waste Management or other private haulers. We are continuing to work with the company regarding the matter and hope to have additional information at the Board meeting.
- 9. <u>Draft Administrative Agreement for Commerce Park Utility Project</u> <u>Enclosed</u> is a draft agreement with the New River Valley Planning District Commission for the administration of the Commerce Park utility project. Comments from the PSA Board would be appreciated. The agreement is also being forwarded to Tom McCarthy for his review and comment.
